- 4. $a \ge 1 = a$ (multiplicative identity)
- 5. ab = ba (commutative law of multiplication)
- 6. (ab)c = a(bc) (associative law of multiplication)
- 7. a(b + c) = ab + ac (distributive law of addition)
- 8. If a = b, then b = a (reflexive law)
- 9. If b = c, then b + a = c + a (identical addition operation)
- 10. If b = c, then ab = ac (identical multiplication operation)
- 11. a + (-a) = a a = 0 (definition of -a)
- 12. $a \ge 1/a = 1(a pi)$ (definition of 1/a)
