The mass gathering has been jointly organized by seven different organizations. It has been organized for seven days. Some of the political scenario has also been reflected in the short story, like how the leaders of the different organizations delivered lectures and stated that after achieving Bodoland, all the indigenous communities must live together in peace and harmony.

The President of the Dari Gwlao Afad, Muhammad Abduz Mannan Shiekh, said, "We also want to live together in Bodoland with the Bodos in peace and harmony. But the Bodos must also respect our rights, like taking additional wives, taking beards, wearing lungis and tufis, and so on. Otherwise, we will also be taking long bamboo sticks. The President of the Hangsw Afad, Songram Singh, has stated that "we also wanted to live in Bodoland forever." But the Bodoland government must respect our rights, like drying Chira and Muris. Otherwise, we will be compelled to take up arms. The President of the Embushrwn Afad, Debashish Ghosh, has stated that we, like frogs, also want to lay eggs everywhere, be it rivers, lakes, or ponds, and increase our future generations. Otherwise, we will also be compelled to take up arms. From the above discussion, we have learned about the political scenario.

Leaders

In the short story Geolang Mel (Open Session), the writer has stated about the situations, which usually takes place during an open session. In the open session, seven different organizations took part to discuss different issues after achieving Bodoland. In the open session, we have seen that the different organizations have been putting up different demands. In the open session, different organizations along with the public have taken part. After one hour, four bundles of Aronai were given to the people. But still some of the people have not got the Aronai including a sitting MLA. Then the President of the organising committee Gwlwndang Brahma has ordered, "Go and bring more Aronai. Hurry up!" After that, the volunteers were in a hurry to bring more Aronai.
